Summary of Minutes of Meeting held on 6th June, 2017

Cllr Osborne chaired the monthly meeting with a full attendance of Councillors, County Cllr Nicky Chopak and four members of the public attending.

Neighbourhood Planning – Cornwall Council, being the Local Planning Authority hereby Approves the designation of a Neighbourhood Area to be used for the creation of a Neighbourhood Development Plan as set out in the application received on the 25th May, 2017 with accompanying plan.

Planning Application PA17/04118 – Mr & Mrs Uglow
Proposed new Agricultural dwelling at East Langdon Farm, Canworthy Water. Reply saying Councillors have no objection.

Planning PA17/02814 – J.N.R. & Mrs S. Osborne – Construction of Extension to Agricultural Barn. Cornwall Council approved this.

Councillor Matters – It was reported that the surface of School Lane is quite bad. Cllr. Adey to see the appropriate people regarding this. Also a large pot hole near Dimma needs attention. Cllr. Nicky Chopak to look into this.

Cllr. Osborne chaired the monthly meeting of the Parish Council with five Councillors and one member of the Public attending.

Electoral Review of Cornwall – The Boundary Commission

is embarking on a short period of consultation on the future number of Councillors for Cornwall Council to take effect in the elections in 2021. They are proposing to reduce the number of Councillors to 87. Clerk to reply saying Jacobstow Councillors feel the numbers should not be reduced but kept as it is now.

Report on Planning Induction Meeting – Cllr.Pallett

gave a short talk on the Planning Induction meeting she and the Chairman had attended.

Planning PA17/12548 – Mr D. Bye & Miss V. Sargeant –

Outline Planning, Water Vale, Canworthy Water. Cornwall Council refused this application.

Planning PA17/03728 – Mrs Joanne Bailey & Application PA16/07297 – Mr & Mrs Fursdon. Both Applications approved by Cornwall Council.

Excerpts from Devon (sorry!) WI Cookery Book.

This is an old book given to me by a friend, I thought I would print some of the more original recipes and household tips.

Tomato Marmalade To each pound of ripe tomatoes, peeled and sliced add the rind of 1 and a half lemons and the juice of 1 lemon and 1lb sugar. Boil together for 1 and a half hours. This makes a delicious preserve

A Capital Nightcap - Drop 4 drops of essence of cloves on 4 lumps loaf sugar, add half pint of good strong ale and a wineglass full of brandy. Make it hot and drink before bedtime.

For a Tickling Cough - Skin some slices of swede, put on a plate and sprinkle with brown sugar. Leave for several hours with the plate tilted. The juice that drains off will be soothing and palatable. Take a teaspoon when required.

Elderflower Ointment - 1lb pure Vaseline Elder Flowers Put the Vaseline in a saucepan with as many elder flowers (not the thick stems) as can possibly be pressed into it. Allow to simmer for half to three quarters of an hour. While very hot, strain through a piece of muslin into small pots, this will be ready to use as soon as cold. Excellent for bruises, sores, insect bites, roughness of the skin etc.

Bananas on Horseback - 4 small bananas, 4 slices of bread, 1 egg, a little milk, salt and pepper. Lay bread in a deep plate, pour over well beaten egg, milk and seasoning. Fry bananas and keep hot, fry the bread mixture and put one banana on each piece.

After Church pudding - Mix together 2 tbsp flour, 1 tbsp sugar, 1 tbsp chopped suet and 1 beaten egg. Add half pint boiling milk and mix well. Bake in a moderate oven for half an hour. Serve with jam, treacle or fruit.

To smooth hands after working in the garden. Dampen your hands and rub with left over coffee grounds.

Onion juice applied immediately to a wasp sting stops the pain and swelling. Onion juice is also good for removing scorch marks.

Invisible mending - pull a long hair out of your head and sew with that instead of cotton.

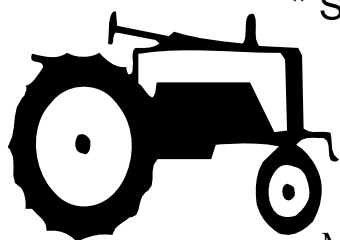

Bob's Gardening Spot

August is the ideal time to feed your lawn with a high phosphate which will encourage root growth. Apply it using the instructions on the packaging. When cutting your lawn raise the blades if the ground is dry and take off the collection box to let the clippings go onto the lawn and act as a mulch.

Hedge clipping should be tackled at the end of the month because they will not grow much more after this.

September is the ideal time to move any evergreen shrubs that are not in the right place because the ground is still warm. Stop feeding any container grown plants now because it will harden any new growth.

You should be lifting any main crop potatoes on a sunny day and leave them on the ground to dry. Store any undamaged ones

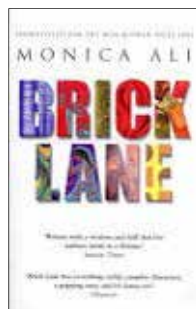


CANWORTHY BOOK CLUB

Starting with The Moment when time stands still for two people at Paddington Station, Claire explores how Fern and Elliot met, how they fell in love and how they split, how their lives turned out.

There was a multiple ending which we found annoying and messy but the book was written with good flow.

May rainfall collected at Canworthy Water was 2" for the month. There were two notable events, very strong winds on the 5th, with gusts of 50mph here in the garden, and 60mph being typical around our local coastlines, and a severe thunderstorm overnight on the 26/27th.

Temperatures were fairly ordinary for spring and no days produced any notable rainfall. Matters changed significantly by the 23rd, with a steady increase in temperature peaking at 26.3C by mid-afternoon. The day had become increasingly sultry by early evening, which moved me to examine the available upper-air conditions for the period to midnight as the thunderstorm risk seemed to be quite high. The forecasting system from this can be a bit tedious, as with most rolling predictions some guess-work is involved - conditions can change considerably in the course of a few hours, you see.

But it was very apparent that at sometime after midnight the heat and building energy, which although even at 11pm was still trapped in (called a "cap") and with the temperature here still 23C at that time, that once the cap broke, storms were inevitable. With a weather front moving slowly from the west introducing cold air at around 30,000ft, a spectacular thunderstorm developed quickly at an elevated level. The storm peaked here about 0200 and was notable for it's intensity. 0.5" of rain fell here in 20 minutes, large hail was observed and for some 30 minutes the thunder and lightning was continuous.

June started cool and with a wet day on the 5th giving 0.7" over the 24hr period. By the 17th, conditions were becoming quite warm once more with 31.1C being recorded here on the 20th by mid-afternoon. This was the highest recorded since keeping records locally in 23 years in Cornwall.

The rain collected for June was 2.98" - we rarely seem to get dry Junes of late. Generally, the weather for the month was fairly typical of the season, with only the odd day producing extensive sea-fog incursions inland.

The girls and leaders from 1st Jacobstow guides are looking forward to lots of adventures over the summer holidays, with some taking part in Kernow '17, a large jamboree for both guides and scouts taking place near Bodmin. 2 leaders and 1 girl are off on international adventures through girl guiding, with Mary going to Holland, Louise to Kenya and Sian to Iceland, there will be a lot to catch up on when we return after the summer holiday.

We would love to be able to offer this kind of opportunity to more girls in the area, but in order to do so we need more adults to volunteer their time, which not only provides opportunities for the girls but also gives the volunteers the opportunity to make new friends, go on adventures and see the joy in the faces of the girls when they have achieved something new. 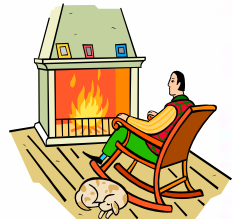

Scott Mann - Your MP

Firstly I'd like to say a huge thank you to all those who re-elected me as North Cornwall's MP. I will continue to be a strong voice in Parliament for North Cornwall. As always I will be holding regular surgeries up and down the constituency. Farming, fishing and regional funding will be the biggest issues for Cornwall as we negotiate Brexit, and I will be speaking up for all three. Our farmers need a simpler policy and fairer system, our fishermen need their territorial waters back, and Cornwall's economy needs continued investment through a simpler and less bureaucratic model. We also have big trading opportunities around the globe, particularly in the food and drink sectors. There are three Bills in the Queen's Speech, agriculture, fishing and trade, all of which will offer big opportunities for growing the Cornish economy further. Meanwhile we have just seen a major milestone passed in Cornwall with the opening of the new A30 at Temple so we can wave goodbye to the endless queues of traffic on Bodmin Moor and this will be a huge boost for Cornwall's economy. Plans are already underway to dual the next section between Carland Cross and Chiverton Cross.

One big issue that has come across my desk since the election is Post Offices and the continuation of services in rural communities. The issue of Post Office services is concerning for many people. If you saw these signs, you would almost certainly be at the World Egg Throwing Championships in Lincolnshire. Competitors launch eggs up to 45 meters across the show ground. The most popular game is "Rushegg Roulette" (based on Russian Roulette.) Players face off with 6 eggs, 5 of which are hard boiled and one of which is raw. They must pick up an egg without feeling it first, and smash it on their head. The first one to smash a raw egg on their head loses.



The organised sport of Egg Throwing dates back to 1322 when the Abbot of Swaton in Lincolnshire provided peasants with one egg each for attending church. When the river flooded and prevented people getting to church, the monks would hurl eggs over to the waiting peasants.
