The Parish Council meets in the Parish Hall on the 1th Tuesday of every month (except for August). Meetings commence at 7.30 pm. Members of the Public are welcome to attend, but any items for inclusion on the Agenda should be submitted to the Parish Clerk at least 10 days before the meeting. There is an opportunity to raise questions at the beginning and end of the Council meeting but questions (and answers) raised at these times are not recorded in the Minutes.

<u>Editor's Note</u> The report on each month's Parish Council Meeting is a summary prepared by the Parish Clerk. <u>We have omitted certain minor items for brevity</u> but a full version of the Minutes is displayed on the Parish Hall Notice Board (after formal approval) at the following month's Parish Council meeting.

Summary of Minutes of Meeting held on 28th April, 2015

- 1) Mr. Norman Osborne chaired the monthly meeting of the Parish Council with three Councillors and three general public attending..
- 2) Audit The Audit form was completed by the Responsible Financial Officer and signed. The meeting approved the Accounts and these were signed by the Chairman and the Clerk. The Accounts will now be checked by the Internal Auditor before being sent to the External Auditor.
- 3) Planning Application PA15/03353 Mr Bridger Installation and operation of a single Wind Turbine (decision PA13/03548) with variation of condition 2 (substitution of approved plans) at Beckaveans, Jacobstow. – (Change access to Turbine). Reply saying Councillors wish to bring to the attention of Cornwall Council Planning Dept. the safety of the access onto the A39.
- 4) Planning Application PA15/03548 Mr Steven Medland, Marlands, Broad Langdon, Jacobstow. Application for hedgerow notice. Removal of approx. 300m of hedgerow for field amalgamation. Reply saying Councillors will go with Cornwall Council's policy on this.
- 5) Councillor Matters It was reported that there is a large pothole at the entrance to Edgar Road from the A39. Councillors to take a photo of this and send it to Cornwall Council for attention. The lock on the Notice Board at Wainhouse Corner is broken, Parishioner, Mr. Mick Carter offered to look at it. It was noted that the Tarmac in front of the Petrol Station, Garage and Post Office/Shop has been completed. This turned out to be the responsibility of the Council and not the businesses as at first reported.



JANET CAROLINE CORY nee Harris 1936 - 2015

Janet Caroline Cory was born on 30 March 1936 at East Panson, St Giles in the Heath to John and Lorna Harris. She had an elder brother Ronald, 7 years older and Gordon 2 years younger.

Janet had a typical farm childhood playing and helping on the farm, joining friends for games in local woodland and in a memorable instance cooking apples in a drainpipe in the playhouse resulting in a fire that burned it down. She was a child during World War 2 so was also used to the searchlight emplacement on Hollow Panson next door, a family from London evacuated to the off farmhouse and German prisoners of war working on the farm. She attended St Giles



School. After school she would walk across the fields to Little Sitcott for piano lessons with her cousin Vera.

When Janet was 13 her father died and the tenancy of East Panson was ended, the family moved to Ash, Jacobstow. Janet went to St Joseph's Convent School at Launceston as they offered classes in shorthand and typing. The pupils had to attend services at the Catholic Church so Janet became a Methodist with a rosary!

Janet, with her secretarial skills, worked first in Launceston lodging with her Aunt Eva, then in Bude which meant she could live at home and cycle to work.

She belonged to the Youth Fellowship, was a scholar, teacher and organist at Eden Chapel. She was a member of Launceston Young Farmers.

Janet met Jim Cory and they were married on the 29 September 1959 in St Gennys Church. On their Golden Wedding in 2009 they had a Special Blessing there.

The couple lived with Jim's parents at Trelay, where Janet became heavily involved in the practical farm work and remained so throughout her married life. She became an expert on lambing ewes.

In November 1960 Ann was born, then in April 1965 Mary In June 1970 after many months spent in hospital with her feet up Janet had a son John. Sadly he died aged 2 weeks and is buried at St Gennys.

Janet was Secretary of the St Gennys & District Horticultural Show for a while. She was a member of Jacobstow WI for many years. She supported the fund raising efforts of St Gennys Band's Ladies committee in several capacities, as Jim and then the girls were players. Janet played skittles for Poundstock and at her death was Chairman of Jacobstow Parish Hall.

After Jim's father's death in 1965 Jim and Janet took over showing sheep at the Royal Smithfield Show. Later following football or rugby matches all with a bonus of a day out in Town. Local shows as competitors, or with Jim as a Judge were all attended. So many lifelong friends were made here and through St Gennys Band and Launceston and Cornwall Rugby Clubs.

In 1979 Janet & Jim moved to Beckaveans Farm and remained there until they retired. Janet was proud of Ann, a specialist Probate solicitor and Mary who came home to farm with her parents after Agricultural College.

Janet looked after Jim for 9 years after his stoke but they still managed to get out and about, Janet using all her organizational skills.

Janet carried on with her busy life after Jim died but unfortunately her health deteriorated and we were all shocked by the relative suddenness of her death.

Janet was a great asset to the community and will be sadly missed by all, especially her family.

Eileen Fry "How I came to Cornwall as a Land Girl"



Eileen has lived in Canworthy Water since 1954. She was born Eileen Clark, in 1929 in London. She had an older brother Sid and an older sister, Lil. Eileen's mother died in 1938 when Eileen was only 9 years old. Her father worked on the London Underground on the night shift so Eileen's aunt who lived just down the road looked after her. Eileen's father used to joke that he'd never done a day's work in his life! On the day before war broke out in 1939, Eileen and her sister were evacuated to Tame in Oxfordshire. By then her older brother was about to join the RAF. The first placement for the two sisters lasted only a week after which they were moved to Banbury where they lived with a school teacher and his wife. In what could have been a sad and difficult time. Eileen thrived. She loved living in the countryside and being out in the open air; such a change from life in London. So when the time came to move back to London, Eileen was sad to leave the Oxfordshire countryside. On her return to London, she was a pupil at Lavender Hill School. Many readers will have seen the old film "The Lavender Hill Mob" On leaving school she got a job in an office in London. One day whilst on her lunch break in London's Oxford Street, the 17 year old Eileen saw a banner inviting young women to join The Women's Land Army. She wrote off, got an interview and was accepted. Bob's Gardening Spot



Now summer is in it's stride, we should be sowing winter pansies and polyanthus. Pansies need to be sown with a little covering of compost and covered with black poly or anything to exclude light. Put them in a shady place outdoors , but check them after about 10 days. Polyanthus are just

the opposite, sow at the same time but put on a warm window sill to keep warm and cover with clear polythene because they need full light..

I like anemones and you can plant them at various times to flower 3 months later e.g April for summer, June for autumn or early autumn for late winter/early spring. July is the best time to divide flag iris's, do this by cutting side bulbs from the main bulb making sure it has leaves on it. You can cut the whole thing up and throw away the old part. Replant the young bulbs just below the surface in groups, having cut the leaves in half. On the veg front you need to be careful and make sure you water green house tomatoes regularly. Do not let them dry out or you will get blossom end rot.

If you are growing cauliflowers make sure they do not dry out or your flower heads will be tiny. Shallots and garlic will be getting bigger so be aware they need sun to ripen well, pull a little soil from the shallots to let the sun harden the skins.



Where have all the aircraft gone?

It is an age away? Well 50 years at least since I first came to this part of Cornwall. Back in 1952, the train still arrived in Bude, and the camp at Woodford housed an anti-aircraft unit that blazed away at model aircraft and at banners towed by pilots who put their faith in the inaccuracy of the gunners and, one suspects, a St Christopher



medallion hanging in their cockpits. Many were the evenings that we leaned out of the windows of Mr Littlejohn's farm at night time enjoying a free firework display as the army lit up the sky with tracer bullets as they desperately tried to follow the weaving radio-controlled target flown by a fiendish pilot from the ground.

Back then, the skies over North Cornwall were full of aircraft, mostly Vampires from Chivenor and Brawdy, and we used to watch them dog fighting high in the blue sky, leaving vapour trails and their sounds far behind them. Perhaps many of the residents cursed them, but to a budding RAF pilot, they held a special sort of magic, mimicking the birds in their brilliant mastery of the air.

Five years later, I joined the Vampires at Chivenor and, for a few dizzy weeks, threw them around the sky, high and low, firing the machine guns ineffectively at a flag towed by a Meteor with one of the braver pilots from the airfield. My ambition to fly the handsome Hunter fighter was thwarted, and I left the beautiful North Cornish coastline for the Midland countryside round Worksop; there I learned to fly the Meteor, and admired, from the ground, the tiny white outlines of the Vulcans flying 9 miles above.

Twenty years later, I was to make the air crackle and thunder as I rode my Vulcan low across the cliffs in one of the many low level exercises that we were forced to play over your lovely coastline. Sometimes, we had to circle at a particular point before we set off to the north-east, and what better place to hold than over the beach at Widemouth Bay where, incidentally, my family happened to be on one of their many annual holidays. On one occasion when I was circling over the beach at about 2000 feet, a young girl said in excitement to my daughter "There's Concorde". My daughter firmly corrected her by saying "That's a Vulcan and that is my Daddy flying it!" Whether the small girl believed her is not recorded!

During the forty odd years that we have holidayed at Widemouth, I have enjoyed the sounds of aircraft, high and low, and, as their numbers dwindled, we have become all too aware that the few aircraft left in the RAF who no longer need to practise their manoeuvres over this beautiful countryside. To an ex-pilot, that is a sad reflection of the times but, to the vast remainder of the Cornish residents, I suspect that the resulting peace is far more welcome.

This is the last year that we will be able to see the last airworthy Vulcan Bomber



give its incredible display, since it will be grounded at the end of the year, but will survive as a museum and taxiing aircraft at the Robin Hood Airport near Doncaster, ex-RAF Finningley. Probably the nearest display site will be RNAS Yeovilton, and the dates and venues will be shown on the Vulcan to the Sky web site.

WEATHERWISE by Monitor

The extension of the Azores High Pressure, which was persistent during the early part of this year, remained a feature of March and to a certain extent in April. March, not normally noted as a dry month,



produced only 1.84" of rain collected at Canworthy Water. Normally, one would expect twice this amount, but it can be variable, 2012 only saw 0.9" collected, for instance. There were virtually none of the gales, heavy rain and hail showers one would associate with the month, all the strong winds seemed to keep to the North of the U.K. Southerly winds gave 14°C on the 7th.

April was also fairly quiet, no really wet days, and again none of the heavy showers one would expect - only the 3rd produced significant rainfall, and it was then very dry until the 25th. Often warm, 18°C being reached on a number of days which also produced quite extensive sea fog inland, late afternoon onwards, the 14th being the most notable of this feature reducing visibility to less than 200 yds in the evening. Rainfall collected was only

1.13", similar to 2013.

I personally don't think there is any pattern to these early dry spells although the extremes seem to be more evident in recent years. I see that the Atlantic sea-surface temperature again is cooling this year, it will be interesting to see if this continues, it tends to produce drier summers.

Warbstow Bury - a brief history

The Bury offers panoramic views of the surrounding country side with surprising little climbing to achieve this. There is a car park at the edge of the Bury, which is found on the road from Warbstow to Hallworthy, on the left.

The Bury are the remains of a one of the largest and best preserved hillforts in the county. The outer and inner ramparts are concentric and complete, the outer having two simple entrance gaps and the inner two inturned entrances.

It is said that the mound in the centre of the hill fort, known locally as the Giant's grave, is where the Warbstow Giant was buried after being killed by the Giant of Beacon.

So, why don't you pick a lovely clear day and have an explore, maybe take a sandwich to sit at the top and enjoy the view.

Saving money on home grocery shopping.

My original plan was to produce an article about which supermarkets deliver to our village. Watching the vans roll past my house, I think its pretty safe to say that most of them do and the good people of Jacobstow are getting the hang of it!.

So, who is the cheapest on delivery charges?. Well, that's a bit like deciding which bread to click on and place in your virtual basket...too much choice. Below are some pointers which might help you make an informed choice.

Asda has a minimum order of £25. Charges range between £1 and £5 and its cheapest slots are Tuesday to Thursday. You can order online up to three weeks before your delivery.

Sainsbury's delivery costs vary between £1.00 and £6.00, with Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evening slots usually being cheaper. There is no delivery charge for shops of £100 or more delivered on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays after 2pm

Ocado charges vary from absolutely nothing (on orders over £40) to $\pounds 1.99$, with the cheapest slots typically being in the evening (9pm onwards) or early morning (6am-7am). You have to spend a minimum of £40.

Tesco charges $\pm 1-\pm 6$ and its cheapest delivery slots are Tuesday to Thursday.


Waitrose is the only supermarket to offer free delivery across all its time slots, but you have to spend at least £60 per shop.

All these supermarkets offer single, three, six monthly and yearly passes, look at their website for details.
