There is an opportunity to raise questions at the beginning and end of the Council meeting but questions (and answers) raised at these times are not recorded in the Minutes. *Editor's Note The report on each month's Parish Council Meeting is a summary prepared by the Parish Clerk. We have omitted certain minor items for brevity but a full version of the Minutes is displayed on the Parish Hall Notice Board (after formal approval) at the following month's Parish Council meeting.*

### ***Summary of Minutes of Meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> August. 2017***

*Cllr Osborne chaired the monthly meeting of the Parish Council with five Councillors, County Cllr Nicky Chopak and one member of the Public attending.*

#### ***Planning Application PA/08407 – Mr & Mrs Ellicott –***

*Retention of change of use to self-contained residential annexe accommodation including extension to form store, Westcott, Jacobstow. Clerk to reply saying Councillors have no objection, but as said before, feel that there should be a condition that the Annexe always remains attached to the property of Westcott.*

***Planning Application PA/05886 – Mr & Mrs Fursdon – Non material amendment (1) for change of door and window material from aluminium to upvc to decision PA/02212 – Land West of Kents Cottage, Jacobstow. Clerk to reply to Cornwall Council that if the Officer is happy with this alteration Parish Council will support.***

***Application for Grants –*** Councillors discussed the Grant Applications and unanimously agreed to pay the sum of £500 to Week St. Mary Football Club, £366 to Crackington SLCC and £500 to Friends of Jacobstow School.

## ***Summary of Minutes of Meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2017***

*Cllr Osborne chaired the monthly meeting with a full attendance of Councillors, County Cllr. Nicky Chopak and three members of the Public.*

**Audit** - *The Annual Audit had been successfully completed and there was no charge this year as the turnover figure was lower.*

**Footpath Upgrading** – *Mrs Mary Carter confirmed the Walking Group had received £1,000 from the Tesco Bag Scheme. She is sending Cornwall Council a list of requirements to upgrade some of the footpaths as they will supply the equipment i.e. Four Kissing Gates plus one ordinary gate. Cllr. Chapman to contact Contractors to see when the job could be done.*

**Road markings on A39 Wainhouse Corner** – *Cllr. Chopak had met with Oliver Jones from Cornwall Council and they had agreed to re-paint the White lines and the boxes at the Wainhouse Corner Junction. They cannot put arrows, as we had requested, as this would have to be a new project and would cost a lot of money.*

**Devon & Cornwall Police** – *Correspondence received from the Cyber Protection Officer. Councillors felt that the Protection Officer should attend the Community Network meeting.*

I'm appalled to hear that the proposed Big Field Wind Farm at Week St Mary is being appealed in the High Court. Proposals by Good Energy to build a giant wind farm in Week St Mary were rejected by Cornwall Council, and again by the Planning Inspectorate on appeal. Despite widespread objection from the local community, it is now being appealed in the High Court. I am very disappointed that developers are failing to listen to the will of local people or accept the decisions taken by Cornwall Council and the Planning Inspectorate.

The planning applications for the Big Field Wind Farm received a lot of scrutiny from local planning officers and national planning inspectors, and was even rejected by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government.

I have written in the strongest terms to say exactly what local communities think of their legal action and to ask them to reconsider. Local people, local representatives and planning experts have made judgements on this proposal and they need to be respected. Meanwhile, I'm very pleased to see that North Cornwall's schools will be receiving hundreds of thousands of pounds in extra funding. I've spent the past two years campaigning for fairer school funding so that our small rural schools get the same amount of money per pupil as a school in an urban area. The new formula will see every primary and secondary school in North Cornwall getting an increase in funding. Recently in Parliament we also celebrated National Farming Day to recognise the exceptional work of farmers as food suppliers and protectors of the environment. We have real opportunities to better protect our environment reach after we leave the EU, and I will be supporting more protection going forward.

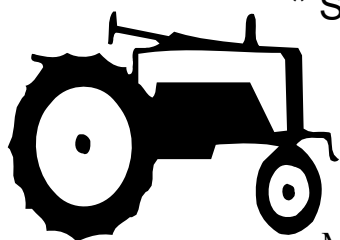

## Bob's Gardening Spot

October is the best time to make a leaf bin. Just put four 3 foot posts into a square, and fix chicken wire around them. Fill it up with fallen leaves but try not to include too many birch leaves as they take longer to rot down.

Now is the best time to plant any bare rooted trees or shrubs, but prepare the ground first and give

them a good feed on the root system, fish, blood and bone is ideal.

November is also the ideal time for planting tulip bulbs, pot them up and you can put the pot complete into the garden if you want.

Start your winter digging on the veg plot and you can cover the dug part with a polythene sheet to avoid it getting too wet, but remember not to walk on it after digging.

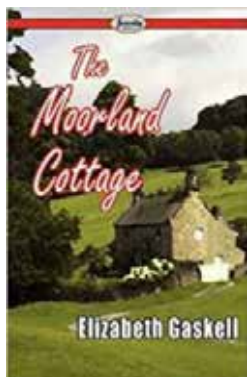

We enjoyed its gentleness as a change.

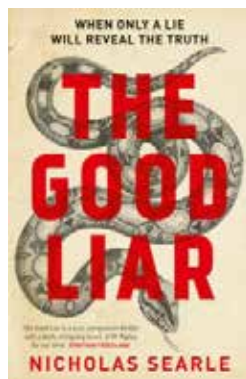


#### **The Good Liar by Nicholas Searle**

One review said this book was a taut, compulsive

thriller with a dark, intriguing heart. A Mr Ripley for our time. I don't think we whole heartedly agreed but there were several twists which were eventually revealed.

A well written book which kept our interest but oh so many unfamiliar words, were they necessary?



As I write this, there are three major hurricanes in the Tropical Atlantic. "Irma" has been the most powerful storm in recorded history to make landfall. I have noticed that those who have a vested interest in the global warming industry are already pointing the finger at climate change being the cause, and giving dire warnings of what will happen if "action" is not taken to address this.

Perhaps, but hurricane seasons vary considerably and whilst trends can be loosely observed, the fact remains that they are even to this day an unpredictable science. In any season, the simple law of averages means that sooner or later you will experience one storm that will seriously affect the Tropical Atlantic. July here in Canworthy Water was barely average for temperatures, and was frequently overcast, only seeing 12 completely dry days. Only the 5th gave a day maximum of 25 degrees, and there was a very wet day on the 21st when 1.36" of rain was collected. The total for the month was 3.93 inches, which whilst not unusual for July locally, is still consistent with previous years, which tend to be indifferent.

August was very dull and overcast, only 6 completely dry days were recorded here and only the 28th managed over 20 degrees, all rather disappointing. The 20<sup>th</sup> and 21st were affected by the remnant of Tropical Depression "Gert" and there were very humid conditions, with some areas reaching 25 degrees to the south of us where there were sunny intervals. A thunderstorm was observed to the distant South East on the 22nd early in the morning, this being only the second recorded this summer - quite unusual even for the West Country which is not really noted for this phenomenon. The total rainfall collected was 3.53", of which the 14th contributed the most with 0.77inches.

So whilst this summer was average, the number of overcast days has certainly affected the ground here which is now quite muddy in places, which anyone who has large grass areas to cut will have doubtless noticed. I can't see it drying out now unless the Autumn is kind to us!

This summer various members of 1<sup>st</sup> Jacobstow guides have had international adventures! Louise went to Kenya, Mary to Holland, Sian to Iceland and others went to Kernow '17, an international jamboree right here in North Cornwall. Over the coming editions you will find out about each of these adventures in a bit more detail, starting with Louise's trip to Kenya.



“Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> July was a very early start as I had to meet 33 other girl guide leaders all aged over 30 at 4am at Heathrow. After about 12 hours in the air we landed in Nairobi. After a night in a hotel there followed a 6 hour journey in a cramped bus to reach our final destination of Nakuru. The following week we spent volunteering at a local secondary school, where a number of the children lived on the local rubbish tip. We played games, taught first aid, made goal post and wash stands using our skills with wood and rope. The children were really happy that they would be able to recreate these at home so their mothers would no longer have to wash up on the floor. We were also able to give them some of the donations that we took with us, including clothes, toys and reusable sanitary towels.

That weekend we went to the Masai Mara for a safari weekend, where we were lucky enough to see nearly 30 species of animals including the ‘Big 5’ of lions, Cape buffalo, leopards, African elephants and black rhinos. We were also welcomed to visit a Masai Mara tribe.

The following week we spent volunteering at a primary and secondary school in the middle of the Rhonda slum. Here we spent the week teaching, and repainting the mud walls. Unfortunately, a couple weeks after we had returned we discovered that the school had to move locations at very short notice, due to the land owner asking them to move on.

All in all it was a fantastic experience that I would love to repeat one day. If any local groups would like me to give a talk on the experience I would be very happy to, in return for a donation to the African Adventures Foundation which would go to support the projects where I volunteered.”

## A HISTORY OF JACOBSTOW SCHOOL. PART THREE

In 1894 plans were drawn up for a new school building on Mr Hooper's land at Higher Kents. This did not materialise and land at the site was given by R.B. Gill of Launceston. On September 9<sup>th</sup> 1895 the school moved to its new premises. During the upheavals Amos Fry wrote in his log "I have omitted to give the regular Drawing Lessons... and substituted reading and writing" which he suspected the children were not best pleased with. The school was renamed Jacobstow Council School, the church having no further control over it. Louis de St Paer was head of the school in 1911 and his daughter and son would help teach at the school in later years. The girls' playground was separated by a wall from the boys' playground. There was no canteen so the children took their own lunch which they ate at Mrs Cowlings' Pennhallym Cottage. The Head gave book prizes at the end of each year for progress and attendance.

Mrs Ruth Leach was a member of the Cory family of Wainhouse Corner. Her memories were of "Morning lessons in Scripture and Arithmetic, then recitation, essays and reading aloud". She recalled writing on slates and "the scrape of slate pencils was noisy." She also recalled that when there was a partial eclipse of the sun, they were taken outside to look at it through pieces of glass that had been blackened by smoke. In about 1910 a new Grammar School was opened at Bude and a number of places were given each year to pupils in the surrounding area, who sat an entry exam a 11 years of age and, if accepted, were admitted free. Ruth Cory was asked to sit the exam. She remembers Mr St Paer offering to drive her to the exam in his pony and trap. She was horrified to find on the day of the exam, that when she arrived in Jacobstow in good time, Mr St Paer hadn't even brought the pony in from the field. They arrived half an hour late to the exam, but despite this setback, Ruth was accepted, and was the first pupil to pass for the Grammar School.

## **FUTURE OF THE SCOUT HUT**

**1.** The Cory Family have informed the Scout Group that the lease for the plot at Wainhouse Corner will not be extended beyond June 2020. The thriving scout group with over 60 children attending beavers, cubs and scouts weekly is now looking to identify an alternative meeting place beyond June 2020.

**2.** The Scout Group recognise the generous support of the Cory Family to lease the land since 1979 (38 years). The Scout Hut is owned by the Scout Group and will have to be removed/cleared from the site. It is assessed that it will not survive a move to another location.

**3.** In the next 12 months the Scout Group will engage with the community, District and National HQs and local community buildings to identify options.

### **The options at this stage are (but not limited to):**

- Move to a community meeting hall in the local area
- Identify a plot of land ideally close to a community hall
- Identify a plot of land suitable for a new building
- Merge with another local scout group (not ideal).

### **4. The key considerations are:**

- Catchment area - siting between Bude, Camelford and Launceston Groups.
- Land - ideally up to an acre adjoining meeting place.
- Cost - rental costs
- Funding - new prefabricated building in order of £70,000-£200,000; new build (£1000/sqm). Scout HQ response.

### **5. Key priorities for next 12 months:**

- Maintain - current hut/site -Keep safe and maintain ash tree.
- Engage - Local hall custodians, landowners and Scout HQs.
- Build - Broad skilled support group.
- Plan - Fund raising campaign and requirements for next 30 years.
- Promote - Local media campaign to build support and support fundraising.
- Initiate - Fund raising campaign.

This change in circumstances should be viewed as an opportunity to improve and strengthen scouting for children in the local area.

### Theft from cars

When you park up:

Try to park somewhere open and well-lit. Lock up – including the boot. Remember to close the windows and sunroof. Don't leave anything on show in your car when you park – not even a coat or empty carrier bag. Remove the mounting, polish any marks off the windscreen and hide the cable and mounting.

## BONFIRE GOODIES

### Ingredients for Honey Glazed Chicken Wings

1kg pack chicken wings  
2 tbsp clear honey  
2 tbsp [soy sauce](#)  
1 tbsp sesame seeds  
100ml soured cream  
100ml buttermilk  
100g mayonnaise  
2 tsp lemon juice  
pinch of smoked paprika  
2 red chillies, deseeded and finely sliced  
celery sticks halved, to serve



### Method

Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 6. Put the chicken wings in a large roasting tin. Mix the honey, soy and 1/2 tbsp sesame seeds in a bowl, then pour over the wings. Use your hands to mix and ensure all the wings are coated, then roast for 20 mins until cooked through, sticky and golden.

Meanwhile, combine the soured cream, buttermilk, mayonnaise, lemon juice and paprika. Season well, then chill until ready to serve.

When the wings are cooked, scatter over the remaining sesame seeds and the chilli. Serve with the dip, and some carrot and celery sticks for dunking.



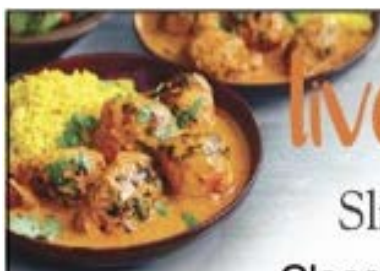
