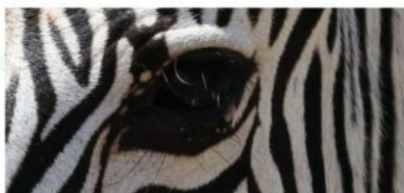
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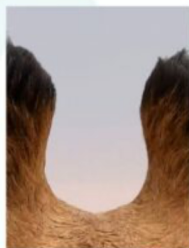

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WEEK ST MARY BONAVENTURES WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Our June meeting featured a talk by beekeeper Deidrie Conniss about bees, their biology, behaviour, and importance to the environment. Deidrie explained that there are hundreds of bee species worldwide, but humans are mainly interested in honey-producing species such as *Apis mellifera*, the western honeybee. She described other bee species, including giant Himalayan bees and stingless bees found in the Americas, and the origins of so-called “killer bees,” which resulted from crossbreeding African honeybees with South American bees.

Bees play a crucial role in pollination, having evolved alongside flowering plants, collecting nectar while transferring pollen between flowers, enabling the plants to reproduce. Different bee species are adapted to different flower types, for example, bumblebees can access flowers with deep tubes that honeybees cannot. Honeybees can be distinguished by the hairs on their bodies, which collect the pollen. We discussed the relationship between bees, wasps, and hornets, noting that wasps are often unfairly disliked despite their ecological value as predators of crop pests.



A honeybee colony can contain over 60,000 workers in summer. Worker bees are female, while male drones exist mainly for mating. The queen mates only once but is able to store enough sperm to lay eggs throughout her life. Colonies make collective decisions, including when to replace an aging queen and when to swarm.

The meeting concluded with a practical beekeeping activity, where members learned about beeswax and candle rolling. Members had great fun making a candle to take home!

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Helping Wildlife in hot weather

As hot weather and heatwaves become more frequent due to climate change, there are ways that you can help the wildlife in your garden to cope. Even a small change can make a big difference, so get involved and let your garden grow for nature.

Provide water for wildlife

Leave out a shallow dish of water for thirsty birds, mammals and insects. Placing stones in a dish will help any insects that may fall in, and provide useful landing spots for them to have a drink too. Change the water regularly to help keep birds healthy and disease-free.



Filling up a bird bath with water

Top up the bird bath. Birds need water to bathe to keep their feathers in good condition, so providing a bird bath can really help. Make sure to change the water daily - you can use rain water collected in a water butt. Remember to clean your bird baths every week to help birds stay free of disease.



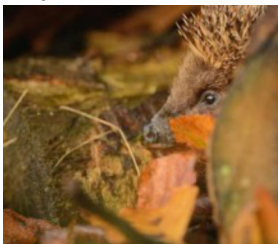
Provide enough cover from the sun

Adding a log pile, rockery and tall grassy areas to your garden will provide cover for frogs, toads and newts seeking shelter from the sun.



Top up your pond

Ponds that are low can be topped up. The best way to do this is through collecting rain water. If your water butt or rain barrel is empty, tap water can be used but only use a little at a time. Ideally let the tap water stand for 24 hours before adding it to your pond. Remember to make sure your pond has easy exit points for wildlife that may fall in, like hedgehogs.



Stay messy

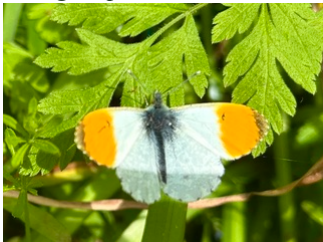
Wilder areas in the garden will provide shade and shelter for a wide range of wildlife, so don't be too tidy.

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May rainfall figures. A total of 2.37", 60mm was collected as against my 10 year average of 2.3", 58.5mm for the month. One rarely sees any extremes in May down west of late, these figures are fairly typical although 2021 was a wet one at 7.26", 184mm.

June started with a thunderstorm mid-afternoon. This unfortunately set a trend with it becoming generally unsettled with a persistent low that became a slow-moving affair to the northwest of the country along with west to southwest winds. Most days had rain of sorts and 2.19", 55.5mm was collected here by the 8th. The second week was no better, westerly winds with temperatures decidedly subdued, some days struggled to get to the mid teens. Matters slowly improved from the 14th, still quite chilly first thing in the mornings but day temperatures more in keeping with summer. I recorded 24.5°C on the 19th. There was light rain on the 20th, but conditions quickly changed the following day with 24.5° by early afternoon.

By Monday the 21st things were very different. High pressure to the east into the continent along with southerly winds started to pull much warmer air up from the mid-latitudes, it was 28° by midday and an associated elevated moisture stream imbedded in the southerly drift set a thunderstorm off to the SSW in the afternoon. The 22nd and the 23rd saw 30° by the afternoon locally, and a sultry night was followed by 31°C on the 25th in the afternoon. It became extremely humid and a severe thunderstorm was observed in the evening. This intensified as the evening progressed and by 2130 I had recorded 88 strikes within sensor range here at Canworthy.

It became a little cooler by the last week, just a trace of rain on the 28th with it becoming more settled by the month end with just light drizzle at times. A total of 3.39", 86mm was collected as against my 10 year average for June of 2.96", 75mm. The thunderstorm didn't produce much in the way of rain here, but some places in North Cornwall had torrential downpours that in a few hours exceeded my total for the month.

July has started with indifferent conditions giving overcast early mornings along with hill mist and fog on high ground and modest temperatures for July, but as at the 10th it has become very warm again with 30°C by early afternoon.



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Dear Jacobstow: I was very proud to introduce my Rural Healthcare Bill to Parliament recently, putting North Cornwall right at the centre of the national debate.

During my speech I called on the Government to develop a proper long-term strategy for Minor Injuries Units and Urgent Treatment Centres in rural areas like

ours, and highlighted some of the unacceptable barriers my constituents face when trying to access healthcare. I also raised the continuing issues we're grappling with around the NHS dentistry crisis, dementia care, mental health services, and the reality that lots of constituents are forced to travel huge distances for treatment, because our transport network severely lacks routes to major hospitals. I will be pressing Ministers to ensure rural communities like ours are no longer treated as an afterthought when healthcare decisions are made, and will be building on my calls in the upcoming Health Bill, too.



My campaign to protect North Cornwall's volunteer coastguards has also continued at pace these last few weeks, as I raised the issue again in Parliament and spoke to BBC Radio Cornwall on the topic, to carry on pressing Ministers to rethink the Maritime and Coastguard Agency's proposed damaging changes. These volunteers save so many lives along our coastline every year, yet the current plans risk driving volunteers away altogether. I have made it clear there are indeed workable alternatives (including, for example, introducing a stipend system for on-call hours) and I'll keep pushing the Government to explore every possible option before this vital service is put at risk.

Up in Bude recently, I joined our local Cornwall Councillors Nicky Chopak and Faye Emery in writing to the Council to call for a much wider public consultation on the 'Future Coast' funding programme. There are clearly a range of views across the community at the minute, so local people must have the opportunity to shape how this funding is spent. We also made it clear that improved disabled changing facilities absolutely need to remain a priority, and that any funding allocated should remain in the town, rather than being redirected elsewhere.

There was also welcome news on banking services these last few weeks, following sustained campaigning from myself and other MPs. Lloyds Bank has announced it will continue accepting cheque deposits through Post Offices and Banking Hubs for the coming few years, subject to agreements with providers. This is a massive victory for everyone who reached out to me to raise this, and one for people who continue to depend on face-to-face banking services after the closure of so many local bank branches here in the constituency.

On another note, I recently visited Beaumont Court Care Home over in North Petherwin, where I spent time chatting with residents and staff about the enormous pressures facing social care at the minute. Staff told me about huge funding shortfalls, lengthy delays recruiting overseas care workers, and the wider problems affecting care homes right across Cornwall. Behind all of those figures are vulnerable residents themselves (many living with dementia and complex care needs) and it reinforced just how urgently social care reform is needed in this country. I will now be taking those concerns back to Westminster to raise with the Government in the coming weeks.

Finally, I've also continued my campaign for greater powers for Cornwall, calling on Andy Burnham (our likely soon-to-be Prime Minister) to make Cornish devolution an absolute priority. Cornwall deserves a bespoke devolution settlement that recognises our unique identity and protects us from any future forced merger with neighbouring authorities, and I'll be making that case loud and clear until we finally get the meaningful devolution we've long been promised.

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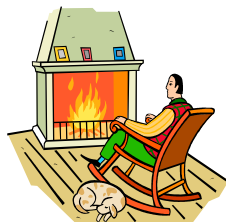

A GUIDED WALK ALONG BUDE CANAL



Peter Daniel, Secretary of Bude Canal & Harbour Society, is leading guided walks along the Bude canal from the Sea Lock to the Barge Workshop at Helebridge. The walks start at the Tourist Info Centre (TIC) with a short walk to the Sea Lock where we learnt that sand was removed from

beaches in the area for agricultural purposes – the local sand was unusually high in minerals and used to improve the Cornish heavy clay soil. The Canal opened in 1823 and the sand was transported by horse and cart from the beach and then along the rail tracks to the Wharf where a Blacksmith, Wheelwright and Carpenter were installed to maintain this operation. The sand was then transferred to Tub Boats to continue its journey along the Canal. A large part of the upper wharf area was surrounded by a high wall to provide secure storage for the valuable commodities of wood, coal and iron needed on site.

Sections of the original wall can still be seen in this area along with The Bark House where bark was dried for sale to the Tanning industry.

Further along the Canal, this building was originally a steam powered sawmill, and later became a steam laundry. Peter paused to explain the history of the various bridges and locks as we walked along the towpath at a leisurely pace and updated us on more recent



developments including the recent dredging of the Canal, bridge replacement and the installation of a fish race beside the Weir allowing safe passage for migrating fish. At the end of the walk, we visited the Barge Workshop where many Canal and town artefacts can be seen, including the sole surviving Tub Boat, items from the old laundry and the Projector from Bude Cinema.

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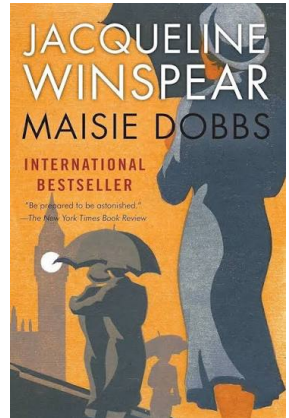

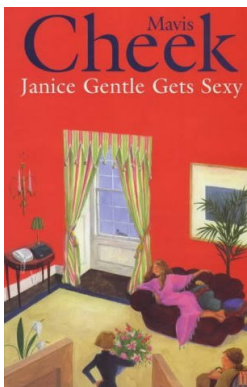
Book Review

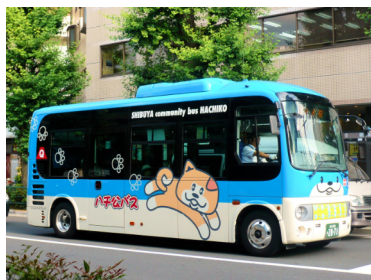

Finally, please remember that, while it may be the early bird that gets the worm, it's always the second mouse that gets the cheese.



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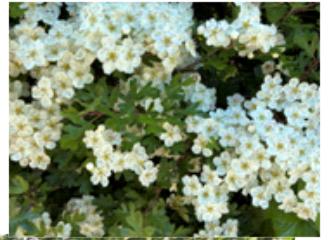

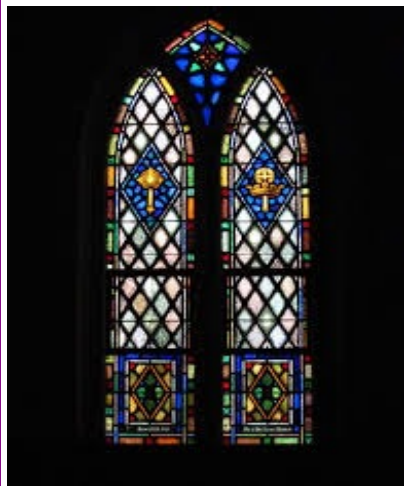


Around Jacobstow
